## Harf A'taf Um and Aoo

## : أَمْ حَوف عَطَفٌ Harf A'taf

If in a sentence two things are mentioned and it is not sure whether this or that then in Arabic language then to ask about the two Um  $\mathcal{L}$  is used between them and the first one occurs after Hamzah Istifhaam . Literal meaning of Harf A'taf  $\mathcal{L}$  is (OR)

Besides interrogative sentence,  $\operatorname{Um} \underline{\mathsf{f}}$  is used in several other ways.

Indeed, those who disbelieve - it is all the same for them whether you warn them or do not warn them - they will not believe.

Harf A'taf : عَطَفٌ أَو In a non-interrogative sentence Harf A'taf عَطَفٌ أَو is used for the same meaning like آ.
